1. Introduction

1.1 The Academy of Live Technology Community Partnership Agreement is a collaborative document that details the principles and foundation that we base our community on. This document outlines the expectations and responsibilities of our staff and students in upholding and developing our community in its core institutional operations.

2. Our Community

2.1 We believe the Academy of Live Technology experience is unique, distinctive in its approach and aims to reflect students' needs and expectations both at the Academy and as a student navigates their way in their chosen profession. Students' experience will be supported by a culture of creative and technical innovation, first-class facilities and excellence in teaching and research, all of which help to build our vibrant community.

Our community of creative professionals is built on an entrepreneurial, forward-thinking spirit. Where respect for each other and our shared values underpin the development and continual driving force for the Academy.

3. A Community of Education, Research and Innovation

3.1 Studying at the Academy of Live Technology should be exciting, stimulating, and inspiring. As well as preparing students for work in the challenging world of the live events and creative industries, the Academy aims to ensure students have the key transferable skills that make them a valuable asset whatever career path is chosen and to instil a sense of learning for life.

 - provide transparent and up-to-date information of the chosen course and on Academy of Live Technology policies and procedures that relate to students.

- reflect critically and learn from feedback provided by academics and visiting professionals in order to improve in future assessments, making informed contributions in all learning environments.
- take advantage of all available learning resource facilities, including the virtual learning resource (Moodle) and library facility.
- adhere to the expectations of intellectual integrity, ethics, and good academic practice.

4. A Community of Respect, Support & Engagement

- facilitate and support all Student Representatives through training, advice, and guidance.
- organise a calendar of extra-curricular activities and events for continued upskilling, social engagement, and development opportunities.
- manage any safeguarding concerns raised in confidence with the required discretion and professionalism as stated in the Academy's Safeguarding Policy and procedures.

4.3 The Academy expects student members to:

- treat all staff and students with respect and dignity and follow Academy of Live Technology policies and procedures.
- adhere to all health and safety policies and procedures both on and off campus, ensuring that instructions are followed at all times from staff and trained professionals.

 of who we should contact in an emergency.
- act as a responsible tenant if residing in accommodation, respecting others in your neighbourhood and understanding that student behaviour outside of the campus community also reflects on the Academy.
- keep staff informed, in a timely manner, when personal problems arise that may affect studies and to seek out support and advice where appropriate.
- take advantage and engage fully in Student Representative systems and any Students' Union democratic elections.
- take advantage of the opportunities available to participate in extra-curricular and social activities across the campus community.
- to behave responsibly and professionally when engaging in on or off campus activities and not to act in such a way that brings the Academy into disrepute.
