Teaching and organisation and support of teaching

- Design, delivery and teaching of classes, projects and other learning activities within the framework of the courses.
- Supervise the work of taught postgraduate and/or research students, as required, to support the development of student research skills.
- Identify gaps in course content and programme structure with colleagues and devise creative solutions which meet the requirements of overarching teaching frameworks.
- Manage the demands of teaching, administration, research and scholarly activity to ensure competing deadlines are met.



- Design, review and adapt academic/programme content and guidance materials by interpreting student feedback, pre-empting needs to enable input to the overall development of the programme and enhance and support student progression and experience.
- Coordinate others and plan assessment deadlines and specific teaching arrangements to ensure student needs and expectations are met and that time and resources are used effectively.
- Undertake research or other agreed scholarly activity in order to contribute to the development of the institution's Scholarly outputs.
- Responsibility for planning and supervision of students' work in projects and assignments
- Assessment and examination of students, co-ordination of tutors' marks where appropriate, and collaborative
 participation in formal and informal assessment meetings
- Responsibility for administration (timetable, attendance records, assessment, etc.,) in support of teaching
- Work to the agreed budget and resources, including liaising with existing industry partners, and to recommend new partners where appropriate.
- To organise and manage placement provision for postgraduate courses.
- Challenge ideas, foster debate and encourage students to develop skills in critical discourse and rational thinking.
- Use a variety of learning and teaching methods/materials (e.g. web-based and blended learning) to enhance the student experience.
- Take responsibility for the pastoral care of students within a specified area, referring problems on where complex or serious.

Quality Assurance, review and programme development

- Contributing to the annual review and quality assurance processes of the courses and activities in the Academy
- Ensuring that the quality of teaching is of the highest standard and meets all external requirements (Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF), University of Bolton validation etc.)
- Engagement with the enhancement and development of delivery in relation to the aims of the institution and the course and in line with a range of professional practices
- Developing and maintaining strong professional links in your area of specialism
- Commitment to innovation, research and development of Postgraduate learning and teaching strategies.
- Incorporating all Backstage Academy policies and procedures into the delivery and practice of the course (e.g., implementation of Health and Safety procedures, Risk Assessment, etc.)

Institutional activities

- Engagement in the academic developments in Backstage Academy
